SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO PROCLAIM MARCH 30, 2011, AS "WELCOME HOME VIETNAM VETERANS DAY".

 WHEREAS, on January 15, 1973, then-President Richard M.
 Nixon announced that the United States would suspend offensive action against North Vietnam; and

5 WHEREAS, on January 27, 1973, direct United States 6 involvement in the Vietnam War was officially ended by the 7 signing of the Paris Peace Accords, entitled "Ending the War and 8 Restoring Peace in Vietnam"; and

10 WHEREAS, a cease-fire was declared across North and South 11 Vietnam and United States prisoners of war were released; and 12

WHEREAS, on March 30, 1973, all United States militarywithdrew from Vietnam under the terms of the treaty; and

16 WHEREAS, because of the civil unrest of that period in 17 history, many Vietnam veterans came home to a politically 18 divided country and did not receive the supportive, appreciative 19 homecoming that is normally given to our servicemen and 20 servicewomen who return home from overseas combat; and

22 WHEREAS, the courage and dedication of our troops in the 23 Vietnam War was no less than their fellows in uniform in other 24 conflicts, and is equally deserving of our honor, gratitude, and 25 support; and

27 WHEREAS, in recognition of the sacrifice and hardship of 28 our Vietnam veterans, the United States Senate on March 8, 2011, 29 declared March 30 as "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" to 30 encourage Americans to give them a long overdue, warm welcome 31 home; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-Sixth
Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011,
that the Governor is requested to proclaim March 30, 2011, as
"Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day"; and
