### SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO PROPOSE THE PARENTAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT TO THE STATES FOR RATIFICATION.

1 WHEREAS, the right of parents to direct the upbringing and 2 education of their children is a fundamental right protected by 3 the constitutions of the United States and the State of Hawaii; 4 and

6 WHEREAS, our nation has historically relied first and 7 foremost on parents to meet the real and constant needs of 8 children; and

10 WHEREAS, the interests of children are best served when 11 parents are free to make childrearing decisions about education, 12 religion, and other areas of a child's life without state 13 interference; and

15 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in *Wisconsin v*. 16 *Yoder, 406 U.S. 205* (1972), held that "This primary role of the 17 parents in the upbringing of their children is now established 18 beyond debate as an enduring American tradition"; and

20 WHEREAS, however, the United States Supreme Court in Troxel
21 v. Granville, 530 U.S. 57 (2000), produced six different
22 opinions on the nature and enforceability of parental rights
23 under the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, this decision has created confusion and ambiguity
about the fundamental nature of parental rights in the laws and
society of the states; and

WHEREAS, Congressman Jeff Fortenberry, representing the State of Nebraska has introduced in the United States House of Representatives an amendment to the United States Constitution to prevent erosion of the enduring American tradition of treating parental rights as fundamental rights that provides: 34

SECTION ONE: The liberty of parents to direct the 1 upbringing and education of their children is a 2 fundamental right; 3 4 SECTION TWO: Neither the United States nor any state 5 shall infringe upon this right without demonstrating 6 that its governmental interest as applied to the 7 8 person is of the highest order and not otherwise 9 served; and 10 SECTION THREE: No treaty may be adopted nor shall 11 any source of international law be employed to 12 supersede, modify, interpret, or apply the rights 13 quaranteed by this article; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the proposed amendment will add explicit text to 16 the Constitution of the United States to forever protect the 17 rights of parents as they are now enjoyed, without substantive 18 change to current state or federal laws respecting these rights; 19 and 20 21 WHEREAS, section two of the proposed amendment preserves 22 the United States Supreme Court's tradition of upholding state 23 laws against child abuse or neglect as representing a 24 governmental interest of the highest order; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the amendment would not impair the tradition of 27 granting parental rights to any individual who has legal custody 28 29 of children, which may include other members of the family, such as grandparents, as mentioned in Troxel v. Granville; and 30 31 WHEREAS, an enumeration of parental rights in the text of 32 the federal constitution will preserve them from being infringed 33 upon by the shifting ideologies and interpretations of the 34 United States Supreme Court; now, therefore, 35 36 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 37 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, 38 39 that the Legislature expresses support for the Parental Rights Amendment to the United States Constitution as presented to the 40 United States Congress by Congressman Jeff Fortenberry; and 41 42

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader and members of 6 the United States Senate, the Speaker and members of the United 7 States House of Representatives, and to each of the presiding 8 officers of the legislative bodies of each state of the United 9 States of America. 10
