## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN EARNED TIME PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, many correctional jurisdictions in the United 1 2 States use an incentive system that rewards inmates for positive behavior, commonly known as credit for good time served; and 3 4 WHEREAS, an earned time credit system was first implemented 5 in the eighteenth century to relieve overcrowding, reward 6 7 inmates who have no behavioral infractions, and encourage participation in inmate rehabilitation programs; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Hawaii does not have an earned time program incentive to provide eligibility for parole of an inmate before 11 the expiration of that inmate's maximum sentence imposed by the 12 13 court; and 14 WHEREAS, an earned time program provides for the 15 opportunity for an inmate to earn a credit against their maximum 16 sentence through demonstrating progress toward satisfactory 17 18 rehabilitation; and 19 WHEREAS, an earned time program is necessary for inmates to 20 have a sense of accomplishment and achievement, both of which 21 are critical to successful rehabilitation and re-entry into the 22 23 community; now, therefore, 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 25 26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, that the Department of Public Safety is requested to: 27 28 29 (1) Review statutory provisions relating to sentences of imprisonment and mandatory imprisonment sentences; 30 31 Plan and implement an earned time program as described 32 (2) in this measure for committed persons who have been 33 sentenced for longer than one year and who have 34 successfully completed the recommended programming 35 while incarcerated; and 36 37



Make recommendations to the Legislature on suggested 1 (3) 2 legislation to enable an earned time program to be implemented; and 3 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public 6 Safety's plan for the earned time program include developing, establishing, and implementing the following standards and 7 8 procedures for the earned time program: 9 10 (1)Objective standards for measuring progress in each of the following categories, to the extent that the 11 services are available at the committed person's 12 correctional facility: 13 14 (A) Work, vocational, or occupational training and 15 16 skills, including consideration of factors such as attendance, promptness, performance, 17 18 cooperation, care of materials, and safety; 19 Social adjustment, including skills such as group 20 (B) living, housekeeping, personal hygiene, and 21 cooperation; 22 23 (C) Participation in counseling sessions and self-24 25 help groups; 26 27 (D) Therapeutic and other similar departmental 28 programs; and 29 Education or literacy programs; (E)30 31 (2) Procedures for evaluating, recording, and certifying 32 33 progress under the earned time program; and 34 35 (3) Procedures for awarding earned time credits and recording and applying days earned under the earned 36 37 time program; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety 40 annually review the performance of each person committed to its custody to date and grant, withhold, withdraw, or restore an 41 42 earned time credit from the person's maximum term of 43 imprisonment; and 44
