## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A PLAN FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE UNIVERSITY WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I AT HILO FROM ITS HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE COLLEGE AND A RESPONSE REGARDING THAT PLAN FROM THE PUKO'A COUNCIL OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I.

WHEREAS, Hawaiian is an official language of the State of
 Hawaii which citizens should have a choice to use as their
 medium of education and in receiving comprehensive services from
 state educational agencies; and

6 WHEREAS, the provision of education through the Hawaiian
7 language is a matter of statewide concern that is appropriately
8 addressed by the Legislature; and

10 WHEREAS, in his 2011 State of the State Address, Governor 11 Abercrombie praised the progress made in education using 12 Hawaiian as the language of instruction, drawing attention to 13 the 2010 awarding of a doctorate degree in Hawaiian and 14 Indigenous Language and Culture Revitalization from the Ka Haka 15 'Ula O Ke'elikolani College of Hawaiian Language established at 16 the University of Hawai'i at Hilo; and

WHEREAS, the path to the use of Hawaiian as an official 18 19 language in delivering state educational services, other than the second language instruction of Hawaiian students, began in 20 1986 with the Legislature's removal of legal barriers to the use 21 of Hawaiian as the language of instruction in public schools, 22 the legislative establishment of what is now the Hale Kuamo'o 23 Hawaiian language support center for public schools taught 24 through Hawaiian at the University of Hawai'i in 1989, and the 25 legislatively mandated establishment of a Hawaiian language 26 27 college at the University of Hawai'i in 1997 to provide "a quality education primarily through the medium of the Hawaiian 28 29 language"; and

WHEREAS, in the short time since the legislative mandate to
establish the Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikolani College of Hawaiian
Language, the State has seen the graduation of the first seniors

from the College's laboratory school in 1999, the first teachers to be certified completely through Hawaiian in 1999, the awarding of the first master's degree in Literature taught entirely through Hawaiian in 2004, the first master's degree in Education taught through Hawaiian in 2008, and the first doctorate taught through Hawaiian in 2010--all national firsts for an indigenous language; and

9 WHEREAS, while praising the progress made to date, the
10 Governor called for the "next step", that is a "university11 within-a-university", to move forward further with the use of
12 Hawaiian as the language of education and its administration
13 "for the benefit of all"; and

15 WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 1070 (2011) was introduced in the Legislature to develop a Hawaiian language university-within-a-16 17 university at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo, incorporating the legislatively mandated Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikolani College of 18 Hawaiian Language and building on its twelve-year record of 19 leadership in institutionalizing the use of Hawai'i's official 20 Hawaiian language as the medium of all internal administration, 21 operations, support services, and delivery of education and in a 22 variety of academic fields from the preschool level through the 23 doctorate level; and 24

WHEREAS, it is appropriate for the Legislature to gather more details on how a Hawaiian language university-within-auniversity could be created at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo to further expand the use of Hawaiian as the official language of administration, operations, support services, and academic program delivery in a variety of fields for the State of Hawai'i; and

WHEREAS, it is also appropriate that the Legislature 34 receive input from the Chancellors and President of the 35 University of Hawai'i System on how the work of a Hawaiian 36 37 language university within the University of Hawai'i at Hilo 38 might integrate efforts on other campuses of the University and at the system-level itself to further support the study of 39 40 Hawaiian language, culture, and history throughout the 41 University of Hawai'i System; and

WHEREAS, the Puko'a Council of the University of Hawai'i was 1 chartered in June 2009 to provide a formal, independent voice 2 3 and organization through which the Native Hawaiian faculty, administrators, and students of the University of Hawai'i System 4 can participate in the development and interpretation of 5 system-wide policy and practice as it relates to Native Hawaiian 6 programs, activities, initiatives, and issues; and 7 8 WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the Legislature receive 9 input from the Puko'a Council regarding the impact on Native 10 Hawaiians in the University of Hawai'i System that would result 11 from a Hawaiian language university within the University of 12 13 Hawai'i at Hilo; now, therefore, 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 15 16 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, that the Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikolani College of Hawaiian Language 17 prepare a plan for the development of a Hawaiian language 18 university within the University of Hawai'i at Hilo; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan be delivered to the 21 Governor of the State of Hawai'i, President of the University of 22 Hawai'i System, Executive Council members of the Puko'a Council, 23 and members of the Legislature no later than August 31, 2011, 24 for their consideration; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Puko'a Council is requested 27 28 to develop a response to the plan based on a formal symposium of the Native Hawaiian entities in the University of Hawai'i System 29 30 that will include at least one representative from all Hawaiian studies programs of the University of Hawai'i System and the Ka 31 Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikolani College of Hawaiian Language; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the symposium is requested to 34 convene at a time and place that ensures maximum participation 35 by faculty, students, and others from the University of Hawai'i 36 37 System, private and public educational organizations and other 38 entities committed to the advancement of the Hawaiian language, and interested members of the community; and 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan developed by the Ka 41

42 Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikolani College of Hawaiian Language consider at

minimum the following issues related to establishment of a 1 Hawaiian language university within the University of Hawai'i at 2 Hilo: the mission, governance and administration, curriculum 3 and degrees, facilities and technology requirements, financial 4 5 and other resources available or that may be obtained, a timetable for implementation, and any other issues, as 6 7 appropriate; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the University 9 of Hawai'i System and the Puko'a Council report in writing to the 10 Legislature and the Governor regarding their response to the 11 plan produced by the Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikolani College of 12 13 Hawaiian Language and to the implementation issues described above no later than twenty days prior to the Regular Session of 14 2012; and 15

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Ka Haka 'Ula O 18 Ke'elikolani College of Hawaiian Language at the University of 19 Hawai'i at Hilo, President of the University of Hawai'i System, 20 Board of Regents of the University of Hawai'i, and Puko'a Council 21 Executive Council members. 22 23
