SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO REQUIRE FOOD VENDORS AND CONCESSIONARIES ON STATE PROPERTY TO SELL HAWAII PRODUCTS.

1 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation negotiates
2 hundreds of contracts annually with concession and newsstand
3 operators for all state airport locations and commercial
4 harbors; and

6 WHEREAS, to the extent that Hawaii may reduce its
7 dependence on purchases of out-of-state products by buying from
8 in-state suppliers, the more it benefits the local economy; and

10 WHEREAS, section 103D-1002, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 11 requires procurement preferences to be given to Hawaii products, 12 which are defined under section 103D-1001, Hawaii Revised 13 Statutes, as products that are mined, excavated, produced, 14 manufactured, raised, or grown in the State where the input 15 constitutes no less than fifty per cent of the manufactured 16 cost; and

18 WHEREAS, Act 8, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, 19 established the Hawaii 2050 Sustainability Task Force, which 20 reported one of its foremost concerns to be Hawaii's heavy 21 dependence on external sources for the majority of the State's 22 food products and produce; and

24 WHEREAS, one of the "Priority actions: Intermediate steps 25 for the year 2020" of the Hawaii 2050 Sustainability Plan is to 26 increase production and consumption of local foods and products, 27 particularly agriculture; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation, through its
authority to negotiate contracts with vendors and
concessionaires, is in a position to help ensure Hawaii meets
the priority action of increasing production and consumption of
locally produced food and products; now, therefore,
