SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE PROVISION OF SECURITY AT THE HAWAII STATE HOSPITAL.

WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Hospital has suffered budget cuts 1 2 and reductions in security positions, leaving the hospital vulnerable to escapes and security risks; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the high occupancy rate at the hospital, coupled with the budget cuts and security reductions, has compromised 6 7 and jeopardized the safety of workers and patients at the facility, as well as the surrounding neighborhood and community 8 9 at-large; and 10 WHEREAS, the patients at the Hawaii State Hospital, 11 including forensic patients committed to institutionalization by 12 13 the courts, are considered to be in need of confinement; and 14 15 WHEREAS, on average, six escapes per year and numerous 16 assaults upon staff occur at the Hawaii State Hospital; and 17 WHEREAS, on December 3, 2009, a forensic patient who was 18 committed to the hospital in 2002 after allegedly kidnapping and 19 sexually assaulting a child, escaped, further illustrating the 20 current security situation at the hospital; and 21 22 WHEREAS, over a year later, this individual has not been 23 24 re-captured; and 25 WHEREAS, there is a need to clarify that the duties of the 26 Department of Public Safety include security at the Hawaii State 27 Hospital; now, therefore, 28 -29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 30 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, 31 32 that beginning September 1, 2011, security for the Hawaii State 33 Hospital, which is a secure psychiatric rehabilitation facility, is requested to be provided by the Department of Public Safety 34 in accordance with section 26-14.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 35 36 2011-1472 SR SMA.doc

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 2 requested to advise the Department of Public Safety as to the 3 appropriate level of security that must be maintained at the 4 Hawaii State Hospital; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health, in 7 collaboration with the Director of Public Safety, is requested 8 to submit a report to the Legislature no later than twenty days 9 prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012 detailing the plan, strategies, and timetable for ensuring the provision 10 11 of appropriate levels of long-term security at the Hawaii State Hospital, along with the short- and long-term strategies and 12 plans to address the State's increasing and aging forensic 13 14 population at the Hawaii State Hospital, including facility needs, capacity issues, and other off-site options; and 15

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of thisResolution be transmitted to the Department of Health and theDepartment of Public Safety.
