SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A VOLUNTEER DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ASSESSMENT AND CASE MANAGEMENT UNIT.

WHEREAS, the co-occurrence of domestic violence and child 1 abuse is well documented in clinical research and literature; 2 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, overlooking domestic violence in child welfare cases can result in catastrophic consequences for the child and 6 victims that survive domestic violence; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, inaccurately diagnosing domestic violence dynamics in child welfare cases can result in potentially life-10 11 threatening consequences for the child and victims that survive domestic violence; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, existing domestic violence service agencies and Child Welfare Services need to enhance working collaborations in 15 cases where domestic violence issues are raised or identified; 16 now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, 20 that the Hawaii State Coalition Against Domestic Violence, in 21 22 partnership with the Department of Human Services, Department of Health, and Judiciary, is requested to convene a working group 23 to develop a volunteer domestic violence assessment and case 24 management unit; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the volunteer domestic violence assessment and case management unit address and appropriately 28 respond to cases where allegations or a history of domestic 29 30 violence has been raised or identified; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii State Coalition Against Domestic Violence submit a report of its findings and 33 recommendations regarding the status, challenges, and 34 opportunities for the establishment of the volunteer domestic 35 violence assessment and case management unit to the Legislature, 36
