SENATE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING FURTHER IMPLEMENTATION OF HOUSING FIRST PROGRAMS AND SERVICES TO COMBAT CHRONIC HOMELESSNESS.

1 WHEREAS, people experiencing chronic homelessness are Hawaii's most vulnerable community members, and are the least 2 likely of the homeless population to reach independent living; 3 4 and 5 6 WHEREAS, persons experiencing chronic homelessness comprise 7 over thirteen per cent of the homeless population in Hawaii, but require more than fifty per cent of the resources allocated to 8 combat homelessness; and 9 10 WHEREAS, hospital and emergency room visits, police 11 interventions, and periods of incarceration for the chronically 12 homeless who suffer from physical and mental disabilities may 13 cost Hawaii between \$35,000 and \$150,000 per person each year; 14 15 and 16 WHEREAS, research has shown that providing permanent 17 18 supportive housing can result in significant cost savings for 19 Hawaii; and 20 WHEREAS, research studies across the country indicate that 21 eighty-five per cent of people experiencing chronic homelessness 22 23 who move into permanent supportive housing stabilize and maintain that housing; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, a number of communities implementing housing first programs are seeing reductions in the chronic homeless 27 population; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes the importance of 30 permanent supportive housing and housing first programs; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, the Legislature enacted Act 212, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, which created a housing first special fund and 34 created a process for implementing housing first programs and 35 36 services; now, therefore,

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1 2 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, 3 4 that the Legislature supports and encourages further 5 implementation of housing first programs and services as a key 6 strategy in ending the chronic homelessness of the most 7 vulnerable individuals in Hawaii; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Secretary of the United States 10 Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Executive 11 Director of the United States Interagency Council on 12 13 Homelessness, the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Director of Human 14 15 Services, and the Executive Director of the Waikiki Health 16 Center. 17 18 19 OFFERED BY: Manu Chun aabland
