SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE AND COUNTIES TO ALLOW PROPERTIES, STRUCTURES, AND BUILDINGS THAT ARE ABANDONED, UNDERUTILIZED, OR UNOCCUPIED TO BE USED FOR EDUCATIONAL, RECREATIONAL, HEALTH, AND HUMAN SERVICES PROGRAMS.

1 WHEREAS, the state and county governments are landowners or lessees of real properties and buildings that are intended to 2 3 serve various purposes for the public; and 4 5 WHEREAS, if these properties and buildings are abandoned, unused, underutilized, or otherwise in excess of their 6 respective need, the public purpose is not served; for example, 7 the University of Hawai'i continues to pay \$5,000 a month so that 8 9 its president can rent a condominium while the 4,500 square foot Manoa mansion remains unoccupied and has been used sparingly 10 since renovations were completed several months ago; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, unused or underutilized properties hold the potential to provide government and community services, 14 15 including educational, recreational, health, and human services programs; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, private providers of community services need more venues for offices and operations; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the lack of affordable land and buildings is a 21 22 critical impediment to providing community services; and 23 WHEREAS, the State and counties, as providers of various 24 community services, could leverage the use of existing 25 properties under their respective jurisdictions by co-locating 26 on the same property various community service programs to 27 address multiple community needs, such as allowing community 28 service program providers to share the use of property of a 29 public school that has a declining enrollment and may be in 30 31 jeopardy of closing; now, therefore, 32 33 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, 34



Resources, and planning departments of the respective counties 2 are requested to compile a report that lists every property 3 under their respective jurisdictions that: 4 5 (1)Consists of land, buildings, or both; 6 7 8 (2)Is abandoned, underutilized, unused, unoccupied, or 9 otherwise in excess of the counties' respective needs; * 10 11 (3) Holds the potential to provide human services, including housing, early learning centers, and senior 12 13 and elderly services; and 14 (4)Is a public school that is facing potential closure or 15 16 consolidation with another school and that includes facilities that would be suitable to provide human 17 18 services community needs; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for each property, the report 20 21 include information on location, tax map key, zoning, land classification, ownership, current status of use, description 22 and pictures of any buildings on the property, and whether the 23 property or building, or both, would be suitable for 24 educational, recreational, health, or human services programs; 25 and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education, 28 Department of Land and Natural Resources, City and County of 29 Honolulu Department of Planning and Permitting, Hawaii County 30 31 Planning Department, Kauai County Planning Department, and Maui County Department of Planning are requested to submit their 32 respective reports to the attention of the Senate Committee on 33 Human Services and the House Committees on Human Services and 34 35 Housing, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 36 37
