## SENATE RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING THE COMMUNITY SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM AND STRONGLY OPPOSING BUDGET CUTS PROPOSED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS.

WHEREAS, the federal Community Services Block Grant program 1 2 can be traced back to President Lyndon Johnson's "Great Society" programs to eliminate poverty and racial injustice; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the Community Services Block Grant program serves the nation's most vulnerable citizens and has a proven history 6 of allowing low-income individuals to achieve economic security 7 and participate more fully in society; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, community action agencies have become a permanent institution in communities throughout the nation; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Community Services Block Grant program allows 13 state and territory administrators to tailor anti-poverty 14 efforts to address specific problems and capitalize on unique 15 resources in their states; and 16 17 WHEREAS, over one thousand community-based organizations 18 are networked throughout the United States, mobilizing local 19 leaders and institutions to address issues specific to their 20 21 communities; and 22 WHEREAS, the Community Services Block Grant program is the 23 only federal program exclusively focused on reducing poverty; 24 and 25 26 WHEREAS, the Community Services Block Grant program has 27 helped over twenty million individuals, nearly five million 28 children, over two million elderly, nearly two million 29 individuals with disabilities, and almost four million 30 individuals with no form of health insurance; and 31 32 WHEREAS, Hawaii has four community action agencies that 33 employ over eight hundred individuals; and 34



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1 2 WHEREAS, Hawaii-based community action programs serve 63,776 individuals in 38,817 low-income families, 8,338 3 children, 11,007 individuals with disabilities, and 3,776 4 individuals without health insurance; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, federal funding for Hawaii community action agencies helps to generate nearly \$47,000,000 in local funds, 8 translating to \$10.92 in local funds for every Community 9 Services Block Grant dollar invested in the State; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Hawaii-based community action agencies exclusively 12 13 serve families at or below the federal poverty level; and 14 WHEREAS, the nation's current financial crisis will force 15 more families to seek out services that community action 16 agencies provide; and 17 18 WHEREAS, recently, the President of the United States and 19 members of the United States Congress have proposed cutting the 20 21 budget of the Community Services Block Grant program by fifty 22 percent; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the proposed cuts to the Community Services Block Grant program will severely impact the ability of community 25 26 action agencies to properly serve the nation's most vulnerable populations at a time when services are severely needed; now, 27 therefore, 28 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, 31 that the Legislature support the Community Services Block Grant 32 program and the many positive impacts it has on Hawaii, and 33 strongly oppose the budget cuts proposed by the President of the 34 United States and members of the United States Congress; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 37 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States; 38 39 Majority Leader of the United States Senate; Speaker of the United States House of Representatives; and members of Hawaii's 40 41 Congressional delegation.
