Your Committee on Labor & Public Employment, to which was referred H.B. No. 1513 entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE WEED AND SEED STRATEGY,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this bill is to:

- (1) Establish a permanent Weed and Seed Program in the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations; and
- (2) Appropriate funding in the form of a grant to maintain the Weed and Seed Program in the Ala Moana, Chinatown, downtown Honolulu, Kalihi, Waipahu, and Ewa Beach communities on Oahu.

The Office of Community Services of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Meadow Gold Dairies, The Gentry Companies, the Director of Honolulu Weed and Seed, and numerous individuals supported this measure.

Your Committee finds that collaborative efforts involving law enforcement, residents, non-profit organizations, community groups and private businesses have helped to reduce crime and improve the quality of life for the designated neighborhoods. The fundamental principles that underlie the Weed and Seed strategy are: collaboration, coordination, community participation and leveraging resources. Weed and Seed is an important

organizational tool and community resource whose strategy needs to be continued.
