Sirs:

Your Committee on Conference on the disagreeing vote of the Senate to the amendments proposed by the House of Representatives in S.B. No. 172, S.D. 2, H.D. 2, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FIREWORKS,"

having met, and after full and free discussion, has agreed to recommend and does recommend to the respective Houses the final passage of this bill in an amended form.

The purpose of this measure, among other things, is to:

- (1) Require that display fireworks bear a permanent label listing the licensee's name, address, and contact information as well as the name and business address of the manufacturer;
- (2) Authorize each county fire chief to conduct inspections of the persons conducting a display, including the site where the display is occurring or will occur within the fire chief's county to determine compliance with the applicable

county code and the current editions of the National Fire Protection Association codes and standards;

- (3) Assess an inspection fee upon permittees of displays under section 132D-10(2), Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (4) Authorize a county fire chief to immediately revoke or suspend any permit issued for display of display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, or aerial devices within the fire chief's county for certain reasons;
- (5) Limit the times in which display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices may be set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise caused to explode from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., with certain exceptions; and
- (6) Require license applicants for and shippers of certain fireworks to provide the counties with information regarding the proposed display event and related contact information.

Your Committee on Conference finds that this measure facilitates the arrest and prosecution for the purchase, possession, setting off, igniting, or discharging of fireworks, thereby increasing public safety.

Your Committee on Conference has amended this measure by:

- (1) Clarifying that the licensee's contact information on the permanent label required under this measure shall include only the telephone number or electronic mail address; and
- (2) Inserting an effective date of upon approval.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the managers of your Committee on Conference that is attached to this report, your Committee on Conference is in accord with the intent and purpose of S.B. No. 172, S.D. 2, H.D. 2, as amended herein, and recommends that it pass Final Reading in the form attached hereto as S.B. No. 172, S.D. 2, H.D. 2, C.D. 1.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding three new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§132D- Labeling of display fireworks. (a) This
5	section shall apply to any display fireworks, articles
6	pyrotechnic, or aerial devices used for a display.
7	(b) Each shell, mine, comet, and multiple tube device,
8	such as finale or barrage boxes, roman candle batteries, or
9	cakes, shall bear a permanent label listing the licensee's name,
10	address, and contact information to include telephone number or
11	electronic mail address. The label shall also list the name and
12	business address of the manufacturer. The label shall be
13	approved by the state fire council and conform to the following
14	standards:
15	(1) Numerals and letters of the printed matter shall be
16	not less than one-eighth of an inch high;

1	(2)	Required statements shall be printed in a color that				
2		contrasts sharply with the background and shall be				
3		printed within a borderline; and				
4	(3)	The label shall measure at least nine inches by nine				
5		inches; provided that if the size of the shell, mine,				
6		comet, or multiple tube device is too small to				
7		correctly display a label of this size, the label may				
8		be reduced to a size no smaller than necessary to				
9		properly display the information described in this				
10		section.

- 13 SECTION 3. Section 132D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 16 pyrotechnic, and aerial devices. (a) Display fireworks,
- 17 articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices may be purchased, set
- 18 off, ignited, or otherwise caused to explode in the State only
- 19 if for display and permitted in writing pursuant to sections
- 20 132D-10 and 132D-16.
- 21 (b) Display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial
- 22 devices shall be set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise

- 13 import shall specify the date of issuance or effect and the date
- 14 of expiration, which shall be March 31 of each year. The
- 15 application shall be made on a form setting forth the date upon
- 16 which the importations are to begin, the address of the location
- 17 of the importer, and the name of the proprietor or, if a
- 18 partnership, the name of the partnership and the names of all
- 19 partners or, if a corporation, the name of the corporation and
- 20 the names of its officers. The application for a license to
- 21 import display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, or aerial
- 22 devices shall include written documentation of the proposed

Report Title:

Fire Protection; Fireworks; Inventory; Labeling; Importation; Permit Revocation or Suspension

Description:

Amends provisions of the fireworks code, imposing new definitions and permitting, importation, labeling, and inspection requirements. Authorizes the fire chief to revoke or suspend permits for enumerated reasons. Exempts movie and film productions from the 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. time restriction. (CD1)
