Your Committee on Ways and Means, to which was referred S.B. No. 779, S.D. 1, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PROCUREMENT,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose and intent of this measure is to authorize an agency procurement officer to use a design-build method for procuring construction contracts if the cost of preparing a proposal is high considering the size, estimated price, or complexity of the project. The measure also provides for the prequalification of offerors and the payment of a conceptual design fee to unsuccessful offerors.

Comments in support of this measure were submitted by Aaron S. Fujioka, Administrator, State Procurement Office; Hawaii Procurement Institute; and American Institute of Architects.

Comments on this measure were submitted by Bruce A. Coppa, Comptroller, Department of Accounting and General Services.

Your Committee finds that the use of a two-step design-build procurement process for complex infrastructure construction contracts will save developers time and money in preparing their proposals and will provide for the selection of the most qualified offeror to be awarded the contract. Your Committee further finds that this selection process, along with the payment of a conceptual design fee to unsuccessful offerors, will encourage

smaller, locally based, design and construction firms to bid on public construction contracts.

Your Committee has amended this measure by:

- (1) Clarifying that during the second phase of the procurement process, a request for proposals will be issued only to the pre-qualified offerors selected for the short list;
- (2) Clarifying that a conceptual design fee will be paid only to the pre-qualified shortlisted offerors that were not awarded the contract;
- (3) Changing the effective date to July 1, 2050, to facilitate further discussion on the measure; and
- (4) Making technical nonsubstantive amendments for the purposes of clarity, consistency, and style.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your Committee on Ways and Means that is attached to this report, your Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of S.B. No. 779, S.D. 1, as amended herein, and recommends that it pass Third Reading in the form attached hereto as S.B. No. 779, S.D. 2.
