HB 289 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. AGR/WLO, JUD

Status Requires an agricultural subdivision or agricultural condominium in an

agricultural district to be approved by the relevant county council by

ordinance.

HB 868 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT. AGR/WLO, FIN

Status Expands the authorized uses of the agricultural development and food

security special fund to include the improvement and investigative studies of dams and reservoirs. Authorizes director of finance to issue

general obligation bonds for the special fund.

HB 1230 RELATING TO BUILDING PERMITS. AGR/WLO, JUD

Status Exempts from county building permit requirements construction of low

risk nonresidential and aquacultural structures, under certain

conditions.

HB 226 RELATING TO LANDOWNER LIABILITY. WLO/AGR, JUD

Establishes that an owner or possessor of private land that is closed to the public owes no duty of care to a person who commits the offense of criminal trespass on the owner's or occupier's land, except where death or injury to the trespasser may result from the owner's or occupier's gross negligence or wilful conduct; clarifies that provisions related to criminal trespass in the second degree apply to agricultural lands that

are fallow.

<u>HB 568</u> RELATING TO AQUACULTURE. WLO/AGR, FIN

Status Increases aquaculture leases from 35 to 45 years and allows a

maximum term of 65 years for ventures in good standing for 10 years or more. Provides lessees in good standing the right of first refusal.

Allows for supportive aquaculture activities.

<u>HB 1228</u> RELATING TO WATER. WLO/AGR, FIN

Status Allows for the preparation of a water development study and

establishes the water development study special fund. Effective July 1,

2011.

HB 1231 RELATING TO DROUGHT MITIGATION. WLO/AGR, FIN

<u>Status</u> Appropriates funds to the counties for drought mitigation purposes.

Requires the counties to report to the legislature on the status of

drought mitigation projects.
