Establishes an Advisory Committee on Short-term Investments administratively attached to the Department of Budget and Finance to

assist the Director of Finance in making short-term investments. Establishes additional requirements in the management of the short-

RELATING TO MEDICAL AND REHABILITATION BENEFITS. Allows an injured employee's physician or surgeon to conduct

diagnostic testing or make a total of one referral to a board-certified or licensed specialist for one subspecialty consultation for diagnostic evaluation and treatment recommendations. (HB463 HD1)
