RELATING TO FUEL TAXES.

EEP/AGR, FIN

Status

Raises the environmental response, energy, and food security tax and distributes revenues from the increase in the tax to the energy security

special fund and the agricultural development and food security special

fund.

HB 1019

RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

EEP/AGR, FIN

Status

Authorizes the revision of allocation from the Environmental Response, Energy, and Food Security Tax. Effective 07/01/11.

HB 1229

RELATING TO ELECTRICITY RATES.

EEP/AGR, CPC

Status

Establishes a process for preferential rates for electricity used for

agricultural activities.


