HB 402 Status

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENTS.

EEP, HAW/CUA, FIN

Requires all environmental assessments and environmental impact

statements to include a cultural impact assessment. Requires OHA's

approval of cultural impact assessments.

HB 927

RELATING TO ROADWAY MATERIALS.

EEP, FIN

Status

Clarifies that state agencies may purchase roadway materials with a

minimum recycled glass content. Allows use of minimum glass of ten per cent crushed glass aggregate in all basecourse and subbase.

<u>HB 99</u>

RELATING TO GRAY WATER.

EEP, FIN

Requires the Department of Health to establish standards for county Status

gray water recycling programs and requires such programs to conform

to the standards.

HB 422

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

EEP, FIN

Applies the solid waste disposal surcharge to waste that is deposited in Status

landfills, incinerators, or waste-to-energy facilities, whether the waste

is disposed of in-state or transferred out-of-state.

HB 786

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

EEP, FIN

Increases the solid waste management surcharge and extends the **Status**

surcharge to solid waste shipped for ultimate disposal outside the State.

HB 1400

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

EEP, FIN

Establishes the goal of reducing the amount of solid waste entering the **Status**

State's waste stream by seventy-five per cent.

HB 504

RELATING TO HEALTH.

EEP, HLT, FIN

Status

Renames the Department of Health to the Department of Health and

Environmental Services.

HB 874 Status

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

EEP, JUD

Creates a minimum penalty for felony disposal of solid waste of \$2,000, and a minimum penalty for petty misdemeanor disposal of

solid waste of \$500.

HB 792

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

EEP, FIN

Status

Requires a supplemental environmental assessment or supplemental environmental impact statement to be provided if an action by an agency or applicant is anticipated to have a significant effect on the environment. Establishes public disclosure system of environmental

review.

HB 1068

RELATING TO GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSION RULES.

EEP, FIN

Status

Remove the requirement that the Department of Health adopt rules by the end of 2011 to implement a Greenhouse Gas reduction plan. The requirement and deadline are no longer relevant and the amendments will allow the department to adopt applicable rules at the proper time.

HB 1346

RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY.

EEP, ERB

Status

Establishes minimum energy efficiency standards for televisions one thousand four hundred square inches or smaller sold or installed in the

State.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
