HB 1520

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP, CPC

EEP, CPC

Status

Exempts third-party customer-generated solar energy facilities and equipment from the definition of public utility. Directs the PUC to

monitor the impact of decoupling on existing electric utility ratepayers.

HB 982 Status

RELATING TO RENEWABLE PORTFOLIO STANDARDS. Amends the definition of renewable electrical energy to include

customer-sited, grid-connected renewable energy generation,

beginning 1/1/15.

HB 566

RELATING TO TAXATION.

EEP, FIN

Status

Provides a \$7,000,000 annual aggregate cap on the renewable energy

technologies income tax credit.

HB 422

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

EEP, FIN

<u>Status</u>

Applies the solid waste disposal surcharge to waste that is deposited in landfills, incinerators, or waste-to-energy facilities, whether the waste

is disposed of in-state or transferred out-of-state.

HB 786

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

EEP, FIN

Status

Increases the solid waste management surcharge and extends the

surcharge to solid waste shipped for ultimate disposal outside the State.

HB 792

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

EEP, FIN

Status

Requires a supplemental environmental assessment or supplemental environmental impact statement to be provided if an action by an agency or applicant is anticipated to have a significant effect on the environment. Establishes public disclosure system of environmental

review.

HB 1068

RELATING TO GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSION RULES.

EEP, FIN

Status

Remove the requirement that the Department of Health adopt rules by the end of 2011 to implement a Greenhouse Gas reduction plan. The requirement and deadline are no longer relevant and the amendments

will allow the department to adopt applicable rules at the proper time.

HB 1346

RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY.

EEP, ERB

<u>Status</u>

Establishes minimum energy efficiency standards for televisions one

thousand four hundred square inches or smaller sold or installed in the

State.
