Extends the sunset date of Act 87, Session Laws of Hawaii, from July 1, 2011 to July 1, 2015; Act 87 excepts from the environmental impact statement law, certain primary actions not subject to discretionary consent and involving ancillary secondary actions limited to infrastructure in public rights-of-way or exempt highways. <u>SB 820</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE EMERGENCY ENVIRONMENTAL WORKFORCE. Appropriates funds for the establishment of an emergency environmental workforce program in light of recent national and local economic downturns and wars; provides for the continuation of emergency environmental workforce services during periods of warfare or significant economic hardship.
