## RELATING TO UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION.

<u>Status</u>

Temporarily exempts unemployment compensation from the Hawaii

income tax for certain taxpayers.

<u>HB 113</u>

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW.

Status

Establishes a voluntary work sharing program for purposes of unemployment compensation within the department of labor and

industrial relations.

HB 519 Status RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

ERB/LAB, FIN

Excludes services performed by an individual who is a member of a limited liability company or a partner of a limited liability partnership who has a distributional interest in the company or partnership of at least fifty per cent, a partner or a partnership, and a sole proprietor from the definition of "employment" under the workers' compensation

law.
