RELATING TO TAXATION.

ERB, FIN

Status

Temporarily requires the issuance of a state income tax debit card to an individual or corporate taxpayer who is owed a refund due to a refundable income tax credit. Limits use of the debit card to purchases of goods or services within the State from persons having a general

excise tax license.

HB 565 Status RELATING TO STATE LEASES.

ERB, FIN

Allows the DLNR and other agencies with administrative control over state lands to enter into lease agreements with businesses that engage in projects under the New Markets Tax Credit Program. Effective

7/1/11. Sunset 12/31/12.

<u>HB 985</u>

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

ERB, FIN

<u>Status</u>

Establishes discretionary request for competitive sealed proposal procedures using the design-build process where not more than five offerors selected on their qualifications submit proposals. Authorizes the chief procurement officer to pay a conceptual design fee to technically-responsive unsuccessful offerors or to technically-responsive offerors if the procurement is cancelled.

Establishes a licensing requirement for large scale dog breeders.

HB 1342 Status RELATING TO TELECOMMUNICATIONS.

ERB, CPC, FIN

Exempts broadband infrastructure improvements from state or county permitting requirements for five years. Exempts telecommunications companies from replacing existing utility poles when installing new or

improving existing telecommunications cables.
