including tax exempt interest, tax credits, interest subsidies or other benefits under the Internal Revenue Code, which is limited by federal

law.

HB 404 **Status** 

RELATING TO STATE MONEYS. FIN HB 562

Status Enhances the State's authority to invest in state bonds.

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT FACILITIES. FIN HB 1252

Status Changes the formula for assessments on construction projects managed by the department of accounting and general services to carry out the program of centralized engineering services, including repair and

maintenance on government facilities.


