HB 782, HD1 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC ERB, FIN DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM.

(HSCR447) Establishes the department of business, economic development, and Status tourism operation special fund to support operations. Imposes a temporary surcharge on certain fees charged by certain departments for

HB 803 (HSCR43) Status

RELATING TO TAXATION.

CPC, FIN

Repeals requirement that \$2,000,000 of tax revenues from banks and other financial corporations be deposited into the compliance

resolution fund. Authorizes the commissioner of financial institutions to expedite the imposition or increase of fees on banks and other financial corporations. Effective 07/01/11 and sunsets on 12/31/15.

HB 560 (HSCR107) RELATING TO FINANCE.

CPC, FIN

Requires the Director of Finance to transfer funds from the Status

Compliance Resolution Fund to fund all interest payments on General Obligation bonds issued on behalf of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and to annually collect funds from the Compliance Resolution Fund to pay the interest payments on the General

Obligation bonds beginning on July 1, 2011.
