conditions.

HB 902. HD1 (HSCR464) Status

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

Establishes the Hawaii Medical Doctor Loan Program for University of Hawaii medical school graduates and medical school graduates with training from Hawaii based medical programs working in rural areas of

the State. Effective July 1, 2050.

HB 1203, HD1 (HSCR335) **Status** 

RELATING TO PHYSICIAN WORKFORCE ASSESSMENT.

HLT, FIN

Makes the physician workforce assessment fee permanent. Specifies what excess funds from the workforce assessment fee shall be used for.

HB 129, HD1 (HSCR71) <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO PERINATAL CARE.

HLT, FIN

Appropriates funds for the continued operation of the Perinatal Addiction Treatment of Hawaii program and clinic. Effective July 1,

2050.

HB 160, HD1 (HSCR494) Status RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES AND HEALTH.

HLT, FIN

Appropriates additional funding for the Kupuna Care program. Effective July 1, 2011.

HB 594. HD1

RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, FIN

(HSCR70) Status

Appropriates funds to the Department of Human Services to match the federal disproportionate share hospital allowance allocated to the State.

Effective July 1, 2011.
