RELATING TO FLOOD MITIGATION.

WLO, FIN

Appropriates funds for flood mitigation on Farrington Highway between Maili and Nanakuli and in the area of Lualualei Valley. HB 496 RELATING TO LAKE WILSON. WLO, FIN (HSCR381) Establishes a pilot project within the department of land and natural Status resources to demonstrate the effectiveness of marine phytoremediation using plants that are native to Hawaii to remove pollutants and improve water clarity in Lake Wilson; appropriates funds for the project. HB 1079, HD1 RELATING TO FEES FOR HABITAT CONSERVATION PLANS. WLO, FIN Authorizes the Department of Land and Natural Resources to collect (HSCR322) fees to cover the technical assistance program costs associated with Status Habitat Conservation Plans, and adopt rules for establishing such fees. HB 324. HD1 RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION. WLO, FIN Establishes the South Kona Wilderness Area to be administered by the (HSCR525) **Status** Department of Land and Natural Resources.
