HB 1431 (HSCR249) RELATING TO COVENANTS.

WLO, FIN

(HSCF Status Authorizes the counties to enact ordinances or adopt rules to enforce covenants that run with the land that impose standards regarding use,

maintenance, landscaping, and setbacks.

<u>HB 1584, HD1</u> (HSCR414) ESTABLISHING A COMMISSION TO EXPLORE OPPORTUNITIES TO FOSTER INTERNATIONAL

RELATIONSHIPS.

INT/ERB, FIN

Status

Creates a permanent commission to explore opportunities for fostering international relationships, particularly when large international events

are held in the State. Effective February 20, 2022.

HB 397, HD2 (HSCR588)

RELATING TO LANDS CONTROLLED BY THE STATE.

WLO/HAW, JUD,

(HSCR58 Status Requires more specificity in all concurrent resolutions for the review of proposed exchanges, sales, or gifts of state land, including whether the land was closed as government or group lands prior to August 15

the land was classed as government or crown lands prior to August 15, 1895. Requires that a draft copy of the concurrent resolution be submitted to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs at least three months prior to the appropriate legislative session. Effective January 7, 2059.

HB 608, HD2 (HSCR368) RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, FIN

FIN

(HSCR36 Status Appropriates funds to be expended by the Department of Health to support ongoing services provided by a Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services certified kidney and liver transplant provider in Hawaii, and to support a federally-recognized chronic kidney disease

management program. Effective July 1, 2011.

<u>HB 614, HD1</u> (HSCR185) Status |

RELATING TO CHILDREN.

HLT, FIN

Establishes a hospital-based screening and assessment and intensive home visitation program under the Department of Health.

Appropriates funds from the Tobacco Settlement Special Fund and the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families fund. Effective July 1,

2011.

HB 688, HD1

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

EDN, JUD, FIN

(HSCR586) Status

Requires the department of education to maintain, monitor, and enforce anti-bullying and anti-harassment policies and procedures to protect students or groups of students from bullying, cyberbullying,

and harassment. Effective January 7, 2059.

HB 566, HD1 (HSCR245) <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO TAXATION.

EEP, FIN

Requires a renewable energy technology system to be placed in service prior to December 31, 2016, to be eligible for the renewable energy tax credit. Delays the beginning of the payout for refundable tax credits claimed in 2012 to July 1, 2013. Requires Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism to complete an assessment on the effectiveness and ongoing need for the renewable energy tax credit

after 2016 by October 1, 2014.
