**Status** 

PROPOSED HD2: Repeals existing certification requirements and establishes reporting requirements to measure the effectiveness of the tax credit for research activities. Extends this tax credit for an additional five years. Requires the Manoa Innovation Center to be leased to the High Technology Development Center for twenty years. Effective July 1, 2112.

SB 318, SD2. HD1 (HSCR1194)

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

EEP/ERB, FIN

Requires businesses in the State to collect a 5-cent fee for each singleuse checkout bag provided to a customer. Allows for exemptions. Provides for fees to be deposited in the general fund. Requires fees to be collected on paper bags in counties that currently have ordinances

banning plastic bags. Effective July 1, 2011.
