SB 1290, SD1 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT. HAW, FIN

(SSCR587) 1920, AS AMENDED. Increases the limit the department is currently authorized to borrow or Status

guarantee on loans from \$50,000,000 to \$ to cover the department's guarantee requirements for its housing program. Effective 7/1/2050.

SB 981, SD2 RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. HAW, JUD, FIN

(SSCR714) Requires certain council, board, and commission members to take a training course offered by OHA relating to native Hawaiian traditional

and customary rights, natural resource protection and access rights, and the public trust. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 985, SD1 (SSCR671) Status RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

Appropriates funds for the operating and capital improvement budget of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs for fiscal years 2011-2012 and 2012-2013. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

SB 333, SD3 (SSCR661) Status RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

Requires 1% of all state fund appropriations designated for the construction and renovation of state buildings to be deposited into the Hawaii historic preservation special fund; adds the costs related to site modifications, display, and interpretive work necessary to enhance the visitor experience for the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum, Iolani Palace, and Washington Place to the uses of the fund; requires reports to the governor and legislature. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD3)

SB 1130, SD1 (SSCR730) Status RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE.

Requires that all letterheads, documents, symbols, and emblems of the State and other political subdivision include accurate and appropriate Hawaiian names and language. Establishes references for accurate, appropriate, and authentic Hawaiian names and words, including proper Hawaiian spelling and punctuation. Effective 1/1/2012. (SD1)

SB 815, SD1 (SSCR620) Status RELATING TO ASSET FORFEITURE.

Requires the forfeiture of any equipment, article, instrument, aircraft, vehicle, vessel, business record, or natural resource used or taken in violation of the laws or rules applicable to the Kahoolawe Island Reserve. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

SB 1, SD2 (SSCR764) Status RELATING TO STATE RECOGNITION OF THE NATIVE HAWAIIAN PEOPLE, THEIR LANDS, ENTITLEMENTS, HEALTH, EDUCATION, WELFARE, HERITAGE, AND CULTURE.

Establishes a nine-member Native Hawaiian roll commission to prepare and maintain a roll of qualified Native Hawaiians; requires the commission, after publication of the roll, to appoint an interim council of nine members from the roll to commence the organization of a convention of qualified Native Hawaiians; requires the governor to dissolve the commission after the interim council is appointed; appropriates unspecified funds. (SD2)

SB 1520, SD2 (SSCR793) Status RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

Establishes a nine-member commission to prepare, maintain, and certify a roll of qualified Native Hawaiian constituents; establishes requirements and procedures for preparation of the roll; establishes a process of recognition and ratification of governing documents and an interim first nation governing council; authorizes adoption of rules; appropriates unspecified funds for expenditure by the office of Hawaiian affairs. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 261, SD2 (SSCR597) Status

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN MUSIC AND DANCE.

HAW/CUA, FIN

Establishes the museum of Hawaiian music and dance design committee; authorizes the committee to invite developers to prepare plans, specifications, and designs for the construction of a museum, and to review for approval the proposed museum development plans submitted by developers; appropriates funds to finance the design and construction of a museum of Hawaiian music and dance. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
