HB 400 Status

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN

AFFAIRS.

Appropriates funds for the operating and capital improvement budget of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs for fiscal years 2011-2012 and 2012-

2013.

HB 711 Status

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

Transfers the functions and duties of the historic preservation division of DLNR relating to Hawaiian burial sites to the office of Hawaiian

affairs.

HB 1489

RELATING TO DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS.

Requires DHHL to develop a pilot program to establish a kanaka Status

village for homeless native Hawaiians.

HB 222 Status

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME

LANDS.

Provides that 5% of funds derived from the public land trust shall be expended by the department of Hawaiian home lands for development

of farm and home ownership.

HB 223 Status

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME

LANDS.

Requires the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to have an

agricultural technician on long term contract.

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HB 1063 Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT,

1920, AS AMENDED.

Increases the limit the department is currently authorized to borrow or

guarantee on loans from \$50,000,000 to \$100,000,000 to cover the department's guarantee requirements for its housing program.

HB 1438 Status

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS.

HAW, FIN

HAW, FIN

Requires DHHL to report on the total number of homestead lots awarded that resulted in actual homes being built and infrastructure being developed. Authorizes \$300,000 in general obligation bonds to build the water infrastructure system for the Honokaia homestead tract

in Waimea.

HB 1225

RELATING TO BINGO.

HAW, JUD, FIN

Allows bingo to be conducted by 1 licensee at 1 location on lands Status 5 4 1

designated by the Hawaiian homes commission. Creates Hawaii bingo commission within department of commerce and consumer affairs to regulate bingo. Allocates 20% of general excise tax on gross receipts to the state general fund; 1% for a compulsive gambler program; up to 4% for administrative expenses; and the balance for deposit into the

Hawaiian home lands trust fund.

HB 1227 Status

RELATING TO GAMING.

HAW, JUD, FIN

Authorizes the Hawaiian homes commission to allow gaming on Hawaiian home lands and to consult with the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920 beneficiaries and designate specific Hawaiian home lands parcels for the purposes of establishing casino gaming operations. Creates the Hawaii gaming commission to regulate casino gaming operations. Imposes a wagering tax on gross receipts of casino gaming operations and provides for distribution to the general fund and

Hawaiian home lands trust fund.
