SB 794 RELATING TO MEDICAID. HMS, WAM Requires the department of health to notify the applicable legislative **Testimony** standing committees of intended changes to the state medicaid **Status** program or proposed state plan amendments submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Authorizes the legislature to enact a statute to prohibit the intended change to the program, to require the department to submit or withdraw a state plan amendment to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, or to make other changes to the program. **SB 978** RELATING TO MEDICAID. HMS, WAM Appropriates moneys to the department of human services for **Testimony** implementing a new information technology system for determining medicaid eligibility. Status

SB 953 RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. HMS, WAM

Appropriates state funds and matching federal medicaid funds for **Testimony** health care payments to address a funding shortfall in the medicaid

SB 785 RELATING TO HEALTH. HMS, WAM

Appropriates funds to the department of human services to match the **Testimony** federal disproportionate share hospital allowance allocated to the State.

Creates presumptive medicaid eligibility for waitlisted patients. **Testimony**

Repeals 7/1/2016.

SB 285 RELATING TO HEALTH. HMS, WAM

Provides for telehealth services coverage for medicaid and QUEST **Testimony**

patients using Kona hospital's medical van program.

SB 964 RELATING TO PUBLIC HEALTH. HMS, WAM

Provides reimbursement to federally qualified health centers and rural **Testimony** health clinics for services covered by all MedQuest programs.

Appropriates funds for direct medical care to the uninsured. **Status**

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SB 951 RELATING TO UNIVERSAL CHILDREN'S SAVINGS

ACCOUNTS.

Testimony Creates a universal children's savings account pilot project under the department of human services, open to medicaid-eligible children **Status**
