DECISION MAKING ON THE FOLLOWING MEASURE(S):

SB 36 RELATING TO HEALTH. HTH

Testimony Requires the director of health to convene a mental health and substance abuse parity working group to determine how the State can

come into compliance with federal mental health and substance abuse parity laws and regulations and enhance existing state parity laws.

SB 41 RELATING TO THE HAWAII PREPAID HEALTH CARE ACT. HTH, JDL

Testimony
Repeals the sunset provision of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act.
Repeals Act 99, Session Laws of Hawaii 1994, which repealed the sunset provision of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act effective upon

certain federal law.

SB 82 RELATING TO THE RIGHTS OF VICTIMS. HTH, JDL

Testimony Amends the crime victims' bill of rights law to include notice or waiver Status of notice as to an offender's unfitness to stand trial, transfer to the state

hospital or other psychiatric facility, or regaining fitness to proceed.

Requires the department of health to provide notice of offender

unauthorized absences.

SB 101 RELATING TO HEALTH. HTH

Testimony Exempts the preparation of poi using traditional Hawaiian cultural Status food preparation practices from department of health regulation

regarding food safety. Requires director of health to adopt rules.

SB 121 RELATING TO HEALTH. HTH, WAM

Authorizes the Hawaii health systems corporation to lease Kula hospital's medical clinic, and all equipment, furnishings, and fixtures therein, to Malama I Ke Ola Health Center, subject to the Hawaii

public procurement code and other relevant state law.

SB 156 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR CERVICAL AND BREAST HTH, WAM

<u>Testimony</u> CANCER SCREENING.

<u>Status</u> Makes an appropriation for breast and cervical cancer screening to the

department of health to reach more women who are eligible to be

screened under the screening program.

SB 166 Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE CLEAN AND SOBER HOME AND HALFWAY HOUSE TASK FORCE. Establishes a task force, within the department of health, to regulate clean and sober homes and halfway houses.	HTH, WAM
SB 178 Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINER PROGRAM. Removes the exemption for dietary supplements from the deposit beverage container program; adds hard spirits, and wine containers.	HTH, WAM
SB 222 Testimony Status	RELATING TO PERINATAL CARE. Appropriates moneys for the continued operation of the Perinatal Addiction Treatment of Hawaii program and clinic.	HTH, WAM
SB 260 Testimony Status	RELATING TO MIXED MARTIAL ARTS. Repeals the requirement that an ambulance with paramedics be present at a mixed martial arts event.	HTH, CPN
SB 598 Testimony Status	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF ADEQUATE NEONATAL RESUSCITATION TRAINING PROGRAMS. Makes an appropriation for the development of neonatal resuscitation training programs.	HTH, WAM
SB 619 Testimony Status	RELATING TO PRIOR AUTHORIZATIONS. Establishes a statewide standardization of the prescription drug prior authorization process.	HTH, CPN
SB 731 Testimony Status	RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH. Adds crisis substance abuse and alcohol treatment as a covered benefit. Amends the definition of "serious mental illness" to "severe mental illness" and to include major depressive disorder, anxiety disorders, and borderline personality disorders. Requires department of health to include in its crisis hotline program for emergency intervention services trained and certified professionals. Prohibits the adult mental health services program from limiting the number of hours of treatment per patient and requires case managers to be assigned based on the DSM IV. Establishes an assertive community treatment program under DOH. Makes appropriation to the DOH to establish a community care crisis center.	HTH, WAM
