Makes an appropriation for 2011-2012 fiscal year for staffing and other

<u>Status</u> costs associated with the licensing of home care agencies.

SB 797 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR HEALTH INFORMATION HTH, WAM

TECHNOLOGY.

Testimony
Appropriates funds to the department of health to participate in federal matching grant programs associated with the development of health

information technologies.

SB 798 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. HTH, JDL

Testimony Expands definition of "quality assurance committee" to include

interdisciplinary quality assurance committees composed of members

<u>Status</u> from various health care organizations.

SB 941 RELATING TO PALLIATIVE CARE. HTH, CPN

Testimony Requires policies of accident and health or sickness insurance to provide coverage for palliative care. Defines palliative care.

SB 1289 RELATING TO HEALTH. HTH, WAM

Testimony Promotes safety and health in Hawaii through increases in the liquor

tax and by assessing a new sugary beverage fee.

Status

SB 1300 RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS HTH, WAM

Testimony CORPORATION.

Amends corporation board composition to add an at-large member

Status appointed by the Governor, give voting rights to the ex-officio Director of Health member, and replace the regional chief executive officer ex-officio voting members with community members from the respective

regional system boards.

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.
