Status

Provides that the date of valuation of marital assets is the date of the dissolution of the marital partnership. Defines duties owed by parties to a divorce. Requires the court to consider dissipation when determining property division and support orders. Defines various

terms.

HB 944 Status

RELATING TO FAMILY COURTS.

HUS, JUD, FIN

Requires a court to allow an alleged victim to be listed as "jane doe" or "john doe" within court filings in cases of alleged domestic abuse where the alleged victim has already received an order of protection, temporary restraining order, or protective order against the accused

party to the petition or complaint; provided that the court determines it would be necessary to protect the privacy of the alleged victim. Also permits courts to seal court records associated with the "jane doe" or

"john doe" filing under certain circumstances.

Status Establishes class A, B, and C felony sexual human trafficking offenses

and class A, B, and C felony labor trafficking offenses, and provisions related to prosecution of the offenses. Establishes civil action for

damages to victims of human trafficking.

HB 1067 **Status**

RELATING TO THE TRANSFER OF YOUTH TO AN ADULT

CORRECTIONAL FACILITY.

Repeal section 352-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, which authorizes the executive director of the office of youth services, with the approval of the family court, to transfer a committed youth from the Hawaii Youth Correctional Facility to an adult correctional facility for disciplinary or

other reasons.
