SB 946 Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY. Establishes the access to justice trust fund under the judiciary as an endowment, to be administered by a nonprofit entity. Requires investment of the principal. Authorizes disbursement of interest earned to fund nonprofit legal service organizations to assist with the legal services needs of the poor, indigent, and other vulnerable populations.	JDL, WAM
SB 957 Testimony Status	RELATING TO FAMILY COURT. Creates a citizen's family law advisory committee to be placed, for administrative purposes, in the judiciary.	JDL, WAM
SB 958 Testimony Status	RELATING TO FAMILY COURT. Establishes a program in the family court for the registration of child custody evaluators; allows board of family court judges to adopt certification of child custody evaluators.	JDL, WAM
SB 62 Testimony Status	RELATING TO GOVERNMENT RECORDS. Require that per-page copies of most government records not exceed 10 cents per page; requires government agencies to keep a written record of requests for disclosure of government records.	JDL, WAM

Testimony

Authorizes the successor to a small estate to close the estate through a Status

Petition process, rather than requiring the successor to close the estate

petition process, rather than requiring the successor to close the estate through probate. Allows the successor to obtain a court order covering

both personal and real property. Applies to small estates worth \$100,000 or less, where forty or more days have elapsed since the

decedent passed away.
