RELATING TO LIMITATION OF ACTIONS. **SB 217, SD1** HMS, JDL Eliminates the statute of limitations for civil actions brought by (SSCR217) persons subjected to sexual offenses as a minor. Revives for one year certain actions for which the statute of limitations had previously **Testimony** lapsed. (SD1) **Status SB 218** RELATING TO HEALTHCARE. HTH, JDL Requires hospitals to provide survivors of sexual assault with (SSCR145) medically and factually accurate and unbiased information regarding emergency contraception. <u>Testimony</u> **Status** SB 934, SD1 RELATING TO BULLYING AND CYBERBULLYING. EDU, JDL Establishes a bullying and cyberbullying policy for all public schools. (SSCR184) Requires implementation of the policy in all public schools. **Testimony** Establishes bullying and cyberbullying reporting requirements for all public and private schools. Establishes a misdemeanor offense of **Status** bullying or cyberbullying a minor. Defines "bullying" and "cyberbullying". Requires the department of education and the charter school review panel to report to the legislature annually. (SD1) SB 921, SD1 RELATING TO MINORS. HMS, JDL Allows a provider of medical services to provide emergency shelter (SSCR216) and related services to a minor under certain circumstances. (SD1) **Testimony** Status SB 110, SD1 RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR VIOLATIONS PGM, JDL INVOLVING MINORS. (SSCR173) Establishes an immunity from prosecution for consumption of intoxicating liquor by a minor if the minor summons medical treatment **Testimony** for another minor who requires such treatment as a result of consuming **Status** liquor. Also provides that immunity may be provided to the

intoxicated minor and one or two other minors assisting the

summoning minor. (SD1)

RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIERS. TIA, JDL SB 824, SD1 Makes null and unenforceable any portion of a motor carrier (SSCR9) transportation services contract or agreement that requires the carrier to indemnify, defend, or hold harmless the other party from any liability **Testimony** for that party's negligence or intentional acts or omissions. (SD1) **Status** SB 643, SD1 RELATING TO EXCESSIVE SPEEDING. TIA, JDL Authorizes the court to order forfeiture of any vehicle owned by the (SSCR10) defendant if it was used in the commission of the excessive speeding offense and if the defendant has at least 2 prior excessive speeding **Testimony** convictions. (SD1) **Status SB 994** RELATING TO NEPOTISM. JDL Prohibits legislators or their employees from appointing or employing **Testimony** a close relative. **Status** RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT. **SB 1502** JDL Prohibits a public official or public employee from appointing, **Testimony** employing, promoting, or advancing a relative within an agency over which the public official or public employee exercises control or the **Status**

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.

relative of another public official or employee employed by or

exercising control over the same agency.
