| HB 1095, HD1 (HSCR59) Status | RELATING TO MOPEDS. Requires passengers on a three-wheeled moped to be at least twelve years of age. (HB1095 HD1) | TRN, JUD |

| HB 1098 (HSCR130) Status | RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION. Defines "after market motorcycle frame" and allows the County director of finance to assign a vehicle identification number to a motorcycle with an aftermarket frame. Except for special interest vehicles, reconstructed vehicles and motorcycles with an after market frame, the bill disallows the registration of uncertified motor vehicles and devices. | TRN, JUD |

| HB 926, HD1 (HSCR527) Status | RELATING TO SHORELINE SETBACK. Prohibits inclusion of accreted lands in determining shoreline setback line in counties with a population over 500,000. (HB926 HD1) | WLO, JUD |

Allows a temporary restraining order to remain in effect for up to 180 days or until the protective order's effective date, whichever occurs first. | HB 597 (HSCR333) Status | RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. Expands definition of "quality assurance committee" to include interdisciplinary quality assurance committees composed of members from various health care organizations. | HLT, JUD |
| HB 601, HD1 (HSCR597) Status | RELATING TO SERVICE ANIMALS. Makes changes to state law relating to public conveyances to the Americans With Disabilities Act. (HB601 HD1) | HSG, JUD |
| HB 1133, HD1 (HSCR398) Status | RELATING TO VETERINARY MEDICINE. Makes intentional or knowing performance of a veterinary procedure in a cruel or inhumane manner by an unlicensed person a Class C felony. Allows for the refusal of services or accommodations related to the solemnization of same-sex marriages, civil unions, and other same-sex unions on religious grounds.

HB 238, HD1

RELATING TO TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDERS.

HUS, JUD

(HSCR393) Status Adds a mandatory prison term of fifteen days and a fine of not less than \$150 nor more than \$600 for a person with certain prior convictions who is convicted for the first time for violation of a temporary restraining order. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB238 HD1)
