SB 1076, SD1, HD1 (HSCR966) Status RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES.

Makes it unlawful for an employer or a labor organization with 100 or more employees and a collective bargaining agreement to bar or discharge from employment, withhold pay from, or demote an employee because the employee uses accrued and available sick leave; provided that the employer or labor organization may require the employee to provide written verification from a physician for three or more consecutive days of sick leave. Allows employers and labor organizations to bar or discharge from employment, withhold pay

from, or demote an employee if the employee is unable to fulfill essential job functions or requirements of the employee's position, provided the employee's accrued and available sick leave are used first.

Effective July 1, 2030. (SB1076 HD1)

SB 1089, SD1 (HSCR951) Status RELATING TO DISLOCATED WORKERS.

Authorizes the department of labor and industrial relations to exercise enforcement powers against an employer in a covered establishment.

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SB 1458, SD2, HD1 (HSCR975) **Status** 

RELATING TO HEALTH. Establishes a five-year medical marijuana distribution pilot program in the County of Maui. Specifies requirements for the licensing of a compassion care center. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB1458 HD1)

RELATING TO SHIPPING CONTAINER INSPECTIONS. Authorizes the Department of Transportation and state civil defense to inspect shipping containers for dangerous materials, including explosives. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB170 HD1)

SB-172, SD2, HD1 (SSCR575) Status

RELATING TO FIREWORKS. Amends provisions of the fireworks code, imposing new definitions and-permitting, importation, labeling, and inspection requirements. Authorizes the fire chief to revoke or suspend

SB 671, SD2 (SSCR621) Status

RELATING TO ETHICS. PROPOSED HD1: Allows legislators and employees to accept certain

invitations or tickets from a charitable entity, regardless of whether the charitable entity is the host or sponsor of the event. Requires these invitations and tickets to be reported to the Ethics Commission, regardless of their value. Effective upon its approval.

SB 921, SD2, HD1 (HSCR971) <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO MINORS.

permits-for enumerated reasons. (SD2, HD1)

Allows a child services provider authorized by the Department of Human Services to provide emergency shelter and related services to a minor under certain circumstances. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB921 HD1)

SB 934, SD2, HD1 (HSCR981) Status

RELATING TO BULLYING AND CYBERBULLYING. Establishes a bullying and cyberbullying policy for all public schools. Requires implementation of the policy in all public schools. Establishes bullying and cyberbullying reporting requirements for all public schools. Establishes a misdemeanor offense of bullying or cyberbullying a minor. Defines "bullying" and "cyberbullying". Requires the department of education and the charter school review panel to report to the legislature

PROCEEDINGS. Ensures that Child Protective Act hearings in chapter 587A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, are consistent with federal Title IV-E provisions.

SB 1187, SD1 (SSCR618) <u>Status</u>

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE V, SECTION 6, OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION, TO PROVIDE FOR THE ELECTION OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

Proposes amendment to article V, section 6, of the state constitution to provide that the attorney general be elected as a nonpartisan elected

official rather than appointed by the governor. (SD1)

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SB 981, SD2, HD1 (HSCR996) Status RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Requires certain council, board, and commission members to take a training course offered by OHA relating to native Hawaiian traditional and customary rights, natural resource protection and access rights, and the public trust. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2, HD1)

SB 986, SD2, HD1 (HSCR999) Status RELATING TO THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM. Establishes a task force to reduce the unnecessary involvement of individuals, particularly Native Hawaiians, with the criminal justice system. Effective July 1, 2011. (SB986 HD1) HAW/PBM, JUD, FIN Pending Referral

SB 1130, SD1 (SSCR730) Status RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE.
Requires that all letterheads, documents, symbols, and emblems of the State and other political subdivision include accurate and appropriate Hawaiian names and language. Establishes references for accurate, appropriate, and authentic Hawaiian names and words, including proper Hawaiian spelling and punctuation. Effective 1/1/2012. (SD1)

SB 1520, SD2, HD1 (HSCR998) Status RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

Establishes a nine-member commission to prepare, maintain, and certify a roll of qualified Native Hawaiian constituents; establishes requirements and procedures for preparation of the roll; establishes a process of recognition and ratification of governing documents and an interim first nation governing council; authorizes adoption of rules; appropriates unspecified funds for expenditure by the office of Hawaiian affairs. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2, HD1)
