SB 106, SD1 (SSCR433) Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PENAL CODE.

JUD

Beginning 01/01/2012, retroactively requires that multiple terms of imprisonment run concurrently unless the court orders or the law mandates that the terms run consecutively. Effective immediately, directs department of public safety to recalculate the sentences of inmates who submit written requests and, if warranted by the recalculation, release the inmates. Clarifies that resentencing of defendants whose sentence was imposed prior to effective date of Act 193 shall not be considered as a reopening of a final judgment or impose any liability upon State for sentencing errors. (SD1)

SB 172, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1092) Status

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

PBM, JUD

Amends provisions of the fireworks code, imposing new definitions and permitting, importation, labeling, and inspection requirements. Authorizes the fire chief to revoke or suspend permits for enumerated reasons. Exempts the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism from the 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. time restriction for the purpose of overnight filming of pyrotechnics to benefit Hawaii's film and television industries. (SB172 HD1)

(HSCR1085)

Status

Expands the offenses of assault against a law enforcement officer

in the first and second degree to include assaults against

firefighters and water safety officers. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

RELATING TO UNIFORM REAL PROPERTY TRANSFER ON

JUD

(SSCR662)

DEATH.

<u>Status</u>

Adopts Uniform Real Property Transfer on Death Act; allows owner of real property to designate beneficiaries to receive real property upon death of owner without requirements of probate or formalities of wills.

Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 946, SD1

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

JUD, FIN

(SSCR622) Status Establishes the access to justice trust fund under the judiciary as an endowment, to be administered by a nonprofit entity. Requires investment of the principal. Authorizes disbursement of interest earned to fund nonprofit legal service organizations to assist with the legal services needs of the poor, indigent, and other vulnerable

populations. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

SB 1533, SD1

RELATING TO CRUELTY TO ANIMALS.

JUD

(SSCR474) Status Clarifies that a person commits the offense of cruelty to animals in the second degree if the person kills without need any animal other than insects or rodents, deleting "vermin or other pests" from this exception.

Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
