Requires that no employee be required to work more than five hours continuously without a scheduled interval of at least thirty consecutive minutes for a rest or bona fide meal period. Requires employers who do not provide a rest or meal break to employees to be liable to the employee affected in an amount equivalent to one and one-half hours for each thirty minute meal break the employee was not provided. HB 1317 Status	RELATING TO LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS. Requires that the wage employees of a contractor providing services to the State of Hawaii and any of the counties be no less than the prorated hourly equivalent of the annual income necessary to meet or surpass the poverty threshold. HB 887 Status	RELATING TO WAGES. Requires 1/10 of 1% of the total amount of public works contracts to be transferred into the prevailing wage enforcement special fund to be used by DLIR for the purposes of enforcing state prevailing wage laws.	LAB/ERB, FIN
HB 1485 Status	RELATING TO E-VERIFY. Requires all entities contracting with the State or any county and any government agency making new hires to provide proof that it has used the e-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of its employees and new hires.	LAB/ERB, JUD, FIN
HB 837 Status	RELATING TO UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE BENEFITS. Authorizes an individual that is attached to a regular employer who is not offering work to receive unemployment insurance benefits even if the individual voluntarily or involuntarily separates from part-time employment, with or without good cause. HB 884 Status	RELATING TO FAMILY LEAVE. Amends the family leave requirement to permit an employee to utilize family leave time to care for a sibling.	LAB/ERB, FIN
