Establishes the reduced ignition propensity cigarette program special fund to be funded by fees collected from cigarette manufacturers to administer and provide staff for the reduced ignition propensity cigarette program. HB 532 Status	RELATING TO IOLANI PALACE. Transfers law enforcement jurisdiction over Iolani Palace from the department of land and natural resources to the department of public safety.	PBM, WLO, FIN
HB 1622 Status	RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION. Requires the construction of a state law enforcement memorial in the capitol district.	PBM, WLO, FIN
