SB 643 RELATING TO EXCESSIVE SPEEDING. TIA, JDL

Testimony

Authorizes the court to order forfeiture of a defendant's vehicle if it was used in the commission of the excessive speeding offense and in at

Status least 2 prior excessive speeding convictions.

SB 780 RELATING TO TRAFFIC. TIA, WAM

Testimony

Requires DOT to establish and operate a county-wide highway traffic advisory radio system to advise motorists of updated current traffic conditions in any county having a population of greater than 300,000.

Appropriation.

SB 824 RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIERS. TIA, JDL

Testimony

Prohibits any portion of a motor carrier transportation services contract or agreement that requires the carrier to indemnify, defend, or hold harmless the other party from any liability for that party's negligence or

intentional acts or omissions.

SB 819 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. TIA, WAM

Testimony

Requires the department of transportation to evaluate a vehicle miles traveled user fee and establish one or more pilot programs to test alternatives to the existing state and county system of motor vehicle

fuel taxes.

SB 828 RELATING TO HELMET USE. TIA, JDL

Testimony Requires helmet use for bicycles, mopeds, and motorcycles.

SB 152 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. TIA, JDL

Testimony Requires a person under the age of eighteen to wear a helmet while

operating or riding an all-terrain vehicle.
