Aloha Senator Gabbard,

It is a privilege and an honor to be nominated to the Environmental Council. As a member of the Council, I look forward to working in collaboration with the other members to address the critical issue of environmentally responsible economic growth and development. I understand and appreciate the State's need to grow and diversify economically to provide new and improved opportunities for the residents of the State, while preserving the precious resource of a clean environment that gives and sustains life for everyone. Further, I believe that the necessity of economic development and environmental protection are not in conflict, and that the concept of environmentally responsible economic growth and development is not an oxymoron.

My perception of the role and responsibilities of Council members is no different than what the Legislature has provided. First, to act as a liaison between the general public and the Director of the Office of Environmental Quality Control by researching and receiving information, concerns, complaints, and recommendations from the public. Second, the Council should provide recommendations to the Director to promote environmentally responsible economic development. Third, the Council should monitor the proper implementation of the State's environmental laws, rules, regulations, and policies.

Through my education and training as a lawyer, and the training received while working for a non-partisan drafting agency, I have developed the necessary skills to qualify as a member of the Council. Primarily, I have honed an ability to be thoughtful and impartial. I also understand the purpose and importance of the legislative process as well as reliance on legislative intent when grappling with difficult questions of how the law should be applied. Additionally, I have the ability to collaborate with people of divergent backgrounds, interests, and strengths to make the group greater than the sum of its parts.

At the end of my term of service, I hope to have helped to ensure a framework of environmentally responsible economic development throughout the State. I feel it

is our duty as stewards of the Earth to leave it as good, if not better, than we found it, and provide equal enjoyment of the Earth to all people. Further, I believe it is the duty of the Council to ensure equal application of the law to all people so that residents, businesses, and all interested stakeholders can make informed decisions with confidence that the law remains constant and predictable. Predictability is one of the greatest engines for economic development and environmental protection.

The three qualities that I possess and that would be most beneficial to the Council are my integrity, open-mindedness, and strong work ethic. It is vital that the members of the Council possess a high degree of integrity because the role of the Council is so important in establishing environmental policies for the State. It is important that the members of the Council remain open-minded and thoughtful when deliberating because the Council solicits information, opinions, concerns, and complaints from the public. My desire to work will also benefit the Council because, if I am fortunate enough to be confirmed as a member of the Council, I will feel no sense of entitlement, but a realization of the responsibility to work tirelessly on behalf of the people of Hawaii.

My experience of going through law school will be beneficial to the Council. As a lawyer, I have been trained to think critically and impartially, and to determine where a specific dispute fits into the constellation of prior decisions. It is important that to ensure predictability for all stakeholders, the Council be able to research cutting edge issues and place them within the context of the State's environmental laws and policies.

One potential conflict of interest could arise during my service on the Council because I work for a non-partisan drafting agency at the Capitol, and this agency researches, drafts, and reviews legislation that relates to the Council and the environmental policies of the State. To overcome even the slightest appearance of impropriety, and in collaboration with my supervisors, I have already been walled off from any assignments that deal with the Council or any derivative issue related thereto.

I am humbled by my nomination to the Environmental Council by Governor Abercrombie. I feel a deep sense of gratitude and responsibility for the opportunity to serve the State, and if confirmed, I will be a thoughtful, fair, and tireless servant.
