The position and views expressed in this testimony do not represent nor reflect the position and views of the Department of Health.

The State Council on Developmental Disabilities (DD) **STRONGLY SUPPORTS GM 613** to confirm the nomination of Bernadette L. Keliiaa for a term to expire June 30, 2015.

The Council's Federal mandate (P.L.106-402) is clear in determining the composition of this body to ensure that all the players involved in the development, implementation, and use of DD supports are represented. The law specifically requires that 60 percent of the membership of the Council be comprised of individuals with DD, their parents, or family members. Additionally, the following agencies are required to be on the Council: Department of Health; the agencies that administer funds provided under the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act; the Older Americans Act of 1965; Titles V and XIX of the Social Security Act; the Protection and Advocacy Agency; the Centers for Excellence in DD Education, Research, and Service; agencies and private non-profit organizations concerned with services to individuals with DD. The Governor's nominee meets all the Federal requirements for Council membership.

Ms. Keliiaa is a parent of a young man with a developmental disability. She was first appointed to the Council in 2006. Her reappointment would fulfill the Federal requirement of having parents represented on the Council.

For the past several years, she has served as Co-Chair for the Council's Community Supports Committee that addresses individuals with DD having residential and transportation options to live in the community, adequate funding for services and supports, and quality assurance. She was an instrumental member of the Department of Health, DD Division's Quality Assurance Sub-Committee that was responsible for providing recommendations into the design of a quality assurance system for the Division.

Ms. Keliiaa is a graduate of the Council-sponsored Partners in Policymaking Leadership Academy (XII) that provides education and training in current disability issues and best practices, and legislative and systems advocacy. Her positive energy and enthusiasm was an asset in the Partners training in providing other participants with encouragement to be leaders in their community.

We look forward to Ms. Keliiaa's continued contribution to assist the Council in carrying out its mission, "to support people with DD to control their own destiny and determine the quality of life they desire."
