Animal Rights Hawai'i opposes further taxpayer monies to be appropriated for the Hawai'i Livestock Cooperative.

The National Agricultural Statistics Service reported total livestock including Cattle, Hogs, Milk, Eggs and Aquaculture value in 2008 was \$83,320,000

Total value of HI agriculture was \$609,404,000 Therefore-

% GSP from all agriculture sales was 1.216% of HI GSP.

% GSP from Livestock sales was .166% of HI GSP.

Discriminating grocery stores such as Whole Foods will not sell meat from pigs confined in gestation crates nor those fed a non-vegetarian diet. Hawai'i has the dubious distinction of feeding more garbage to pigs than any other state. In fact, several states have banned feeding swill to pigs for public health reasons.

Whole Foods will also not buy eggs from battery farms. This is a trend in consumer choice that is being ignored by local farmers.

This morning's headline in the Star Advertiser was "Social service funding drying up" Whilst education and health care for the poor are struggling, how can you consider throwing more taxpayer dollars into the HLC money pit?
