February 24, 2011

RELATING TO THE WESTERN INTERSTATE COMMISSION FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

House Bill No. 1323, H.D. 1, establishes the Hawaii Western Interstate

Commission for Higher Education within the University of Hawaii. The bill allows Hawaii

Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education to establish a repayment policy for
students who receive financial support from the Western Interstate Commission for
Higher Education's Hawaii Professional Student Exchange Program. House Bill

No. 1323, H.D. 1, creates a Professional Student Exchange Program special fund to
finance professional student exchange program activities and collection of delinquent
obligations. The fund would generate revenues through repayment of financial support
from former or current participants of the program and interest.

As a matter of general policy, the Department of Budget and Finance does not support the creation of any special fund which does not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.3 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes. Special or revolving funds should:

1) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and charges made upon the users or beneficiaries of the program; 2) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 3) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. In regards to House Bill No. 1323, H.D. 1, it is difficult to determine whether the fund would be self-sustaining.

HB 1323, HD1 RELATING TO THE WESTERN INTERSTATE COMMISSION FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

Chair Oshiro, Vice Chair Lee and Members of the Committee:

The purpose of HB 1323 is to: 1) establish and define the Hawai'i WICHE Commission as an entity, 2) provide the Hawai'i Commission with authority to establish a repayment policy for students who receive support through the WICHE Professional Student Exchange Program ("PSEP"), and 3) create a special fund to administer the program. As presently written, Chapter 304A, Part VII, Subpart D only provides for appointment of commissioners to the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education and does not provide for or allow the Hawai'i commissioners to independently set terms and conditions upon Hawai'i PSEP students that receive support. We ask that HB1323,HD1 be modified to change the effective date to July 1, 2011 to facilitate immediate implementation to insure the State benefits from the return of our Hawai'i residents during these tough economic times.

The WICHE Commissioners support the overall intent of this bill and appreciate the Legislature's continuing support of WICHE and concern for improving the return rates of Hawai'i residents who receive state support through WICHE-PSEP. The return of these professionals to the State of Hawai'i is very important to the economic and social health and well being of our State. Especially during these tough economic times, we should encourage the support of students who return to the State of Hawai'i after receiving assistance. One of the ways of assuring state policymakers that the State is getting a good return on their WICHE-PSEP investment dollars is by selecting those students who are willing to make a commitment to return to Hawai'i in exchange for the State's support of their professional education.

WICHE studies have shown that states that contractually require their students to return to the state have a higher rate of return and have an easier time providing return-rate information of their graduates, whereas other states rely on State licensing boards, professional associations and/or the department of labor. In 2006, the average rate of return for reporting WICHE states was 59 percent. The average rate of return for WICHE "payback states" was 74 percent. Non payback states tend to have lower rates, with an average of 39 percent.

Passing of this bill will give the WICHE Commissioners authority to develop a repayment policy for PSEP participants who decide not to return to Hawai'i to work. Furthermore, with the establishment of the special fund any dollars received from repayments will increase access for Hawai'i residents by supplementing legislative appropriations in support of professional education otherwise unavailable to our Hawai'i residents at home.
