HOUSE BILL NO. 1483 RELATING TO THE MOLOKAI IRRIGATION SYSTEM

Chairperson Oshiro and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on House Bill No. 1483. The purpose of this bill is to direct the Department of Agriculture to provide water to Molokai Irrigation System (MIS) users who lease tracts of land under Section 207 of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended, at a reduced rate. It also requires the Department of Agriculture (DOA) to forgive past due bills for the provision of irrigation water for Molokai homestead farmers. The department respectfully opposes Section 2(b) of the bill requiring the DOA to forgive all amounts owed by any Molokai homestead farmer for the provision of irrigation water that are past due as of the effective date of this Act. We offer comments regarding irrigation water at a reduced rate for homesteaders.

The MIS is part of the State's Irrigation System Revolving fund (Fund). Due to the nature of a revolving fund, this fund is meant to be self-sufficient but a combined effort between the administration, legislature, and board of agriculture resulted in a general fund supplement in order to keep irrigation water rates artificially low to encourage agricultural development. It is only with this supplement that the Fund is able to remain solvent. As an alternative to forgiving the debt and having the department request additional support, the department respectfully

requests that the legislature appropriate additional general funds to the department to specifically cover the outstanding debt.

The outstanding balance owed by the system's homesteaders is over \$350,000 and represents over 80% of the current delinquency balance owed on the MIS. A legislative audit performed on the MIS in 2007 identified the outstanding receivables as a weakness that needed to be addressed. In an acknowledgement of the high outstanding balances, the department has been working with the Molokai Irrigation System Water Users Advisory Board to draft collection procedures and policies that are enforceable and fair. A partial balance waiver has been discussed in recognition that a collection agency would only return a portion of the outstanding balance and keep the rest as payment. For the rest of the outstanding debt, a repayment plan is being proposed for the account holder. The repayment plan, in combination with having a portion of the balance forgiven, would be contingent upon an agreement with the account holder that all usage, from the date the repayment plan is executed, would be paid in full, when due at the end of the month.

An appropriation to reduce the monthly cost for the delivery of irrigation water seems feasible given the language in Section 2(a), combined with Section 3. A maximum percentage of 50% will lower the delivery fee to \$0.25/1,000 gallons for the 2012 fiscal year. We also respectfully recommend that the delivery fee go no lower than \$0.25/1,000 gallons of water delivered as anything less may encourage waste. The Agricultural Resource Management Division estimates that \$55,000 is needed for each fiscal year, 2012 and 2013, to reduce the water delivery fee by 50%. This figure is the minimum amount that must be inserted into the blanks in Section 3. If this bill passes without an appropriation in Section 3, the Fund may become insolvent in subsequent years.

I support HB1483 on the following points (1) provide a reduction in rate to Hawaiian Homestead Users, and (2) appropriating funds to

cover operational costs of the Molokai Irrigation System. However, I don't support that portion of the bill (as it is written) that would forgive delinquent amounts for Hawaiian Homestead Users, or anyone else for that matter. Recently, the Molokai Irrigation System Water Users Advisory Board gave a recommendation to the Department of Agriculture that would forgive delinquent accounts for those "users of record" that are diseased. This, I feel is fare. All others should be held accountable for water usage.
