## HB 1489 HD1, RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS

Chair Cabanilla, Vice-Chair Chong and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) recognizes and appreciates the intent of this measure to address and mitigate our state's growing homeless/houseless population, and specifically native Hawaiians.

As proposed in this bill, implementation of this type of pilot program is problematic for several reasons. First, the mission of our department is return native Hawaiians (at 50% blood quantum or more) to the land. This would be difficult to implement without a reasonable method of verifying the blood quantum or beneficiary status of each participant in this "kanaka village" program. Also, this largely is a social service program, but there is no social service component or agency that will be involved. Finally, this measure does not currently authorize any appropriation, so resources allocated to this pilot would take away from other homestead developments.
