#### TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT

#### Re: H.B. 1513 Relating to the Weed and Seed Strategy

Good Morning Chair Ige, Vice Chair Kidani, and committee members. My name is Mila Kaahanui, Executive Director of the Office of Community Services (OCS), an agency administratively attached to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DLIR). We appreciate this opportunity to testify in support of this measure.

The Office of Community Services and the Weed and Seed Program as currently run have been partners for a number of years through the 42F grant process. We would like to confine our comments to the current incarnation of the bill.

Again, OCS wholeheartedly supports the creation of a program under LBR903. However, we will defer to the Legislature, the Governor, and Department of Budget and Finance, and our home Department of Labor and Industrial Relations with regards to any issue involving the funding priorities of the State.

OCS has two comments on the measure before you. 1) As the funding mechanism is A funds, OCS will be required to RFP out this program. Also, since there are four qualified sites, we must

make funds available to all eligible Weed and Seed sites. 2) Secondly, there is no mechanism for OCS to receive any administrative funds. Although, as explained in hearing for SCR 150, we do have CSBG funds to provide for staffing of programs, an exclusion of any money from the state for a State-funded program may violate certain rules for these Federal funds. OCS requests an amount of 5% to fund part of one specialist's time to administer the program and leverage the Federal funds.

We appreciate the opportunity to testify on this measure.

Aloha. As Chairs of the Weed and Seed Steering Committees for the Kalihi-Palama-Chinatown, Ala Moana-Sheridan-McCully, Waipahu and Ewa Beach sites, we would like to express our strong support of H.B. 1513, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, which provides funding for the continuation of the Weed and Seed strategy through establishment of a program within the State Department of Labor.

Operation Weed and Seed (W&S) is a U.S. Department of Justice initiative that was established in 1991. It is a community-based, multi-agency approach to addressing violent crime, gang activity, drug use, and drug trafficking in communities that were hardest hit by violence and eroding social and economic stability. The W&S strategy is based on a two-pronged approach:

- Law Enforcement agencies and criminal justice officials cooperate with local residents to "weed out" criminal activity in the designated area.
- 2) Social service providers and economic revitalization efforts are introduced to "seed" the area, ensuring long-term positive change and a higher quality of life for residents.

In the Kalihi-Palama-Chinatown, Ala Moana-Sheridan-McCully communities, Weed & Seed has helped to actively enforce against teen drinking, juvenile involvement with gangs, truancy and curfew violations, drug trafficking, car break-ins, prostitution and gambling. There has been an increase in the monitoring of schools and public parks for those drinking in public and creating graffiti. There has been an increase in Citizen's Patrol participation, and a forum has been developed for on-going education of volunteers in crime prevention strategies. W&S has worked with collaborative partner agencies to provide Late Night Basketball and Late Night Volleyball leagues for youth during summer and winter breaks, and has provided law enforcement as mentors to community youth through ropes course, glass-bottom boat fishing, and horseback riding excursions. It has further established community safe havens at Mayor Wright Homes and Kuhio Park Terrace to provide afterschool homework help and literacy services for public housing youth, and has also worked with faith-based partners to start-up and maintain the Life 360 "Total Life Turnaround" program on Sundays for youth from various public housing locations. W&S efforts in the area have been known to build community collaboration and increase agency-to-agency communication and partnership. The area's Neighborhood

Restoration projects have included: monthly Kalihi and Makiki Stream restoration projects, graffiti paint-outs, and bringing together of "area adoption" groups that take care of their immediate neighborhoods.

In Waipahu, W&S has helped to coordinate drug busts, truancy sweeps, warrant sweeps, drinking enforcement operations and parking enforcement efforts throughout the site. W&S has also helped to "seed" programs in the community. In partnership with GEAR Up Waipahu, New Hope Leeward and Waipahu High School, W&S is working with students who are currently failing or potentially failing their freshman school year. In partnership with the Federal Bureau of Investigations, high school youth are being mentored and taught skills in decision making, communication and teamwork. Through a partnership with Parks and Recreation Project Ho'omana, W&S works with truant youth to educate them on juvenile laws and to help them to make better choices. Through the Waipahu Community Coalition, W&S is able to co-sponsor community wide events such as the Waipahu 5K Cane Haul Run, 'Ohana Health and Empowerment Fair and Adopt-A-Family projects. Furthermore, W&S sponsors and supports ongoing neighborhood restoration projects such as the Waipahu Beautification Day, Project CLEAN, graffiti paint outs, Kapakahi Stream clean up, Aloha 'Aina Earth Day and the Pearl Harbor Bike Path clean up. W&S has established a safe haven at the Waipahu I housing project that is utilized by the public health nurses to provide health education, nutrition and exercise workshops for families. W&S also has established a sub-station in the site located in Oasis at Waipahu.

In Ewa Beach, W&S has also helped to coordinate drug busts and quarterly truancy sweeps at James Campbell High School. It has also coordinated a Drive Safe 4 Ewa and Kapolei campaign, instituted a successful Community Policing Program, performed park sweeps and other weeding activities. It has also helped to "seed" programs in the community – a summer culinary arts program for teens, junior golf, bowling, water sports, after-school programs at the Boys & Girls Club, microenterprise training classes, and more. Coordination of prevention efforts has been made possible through a community coalition called "EWAlution 96706" combining the word "evolution" and the unity of communities within Ewa Beach. EWAlution, which currently consists of 42 service providers, often does community service projects at James Campbell High School and Ilima Intermediate School. Community beautification efforts are ongoing, with regularly-scheduled graffiti paint-out days and community clean-up events. Partnering with the City Department of Environmental Services, James Campbell High School, and the Ewa Beach Lions Club, Weed and Seed hosts Make a Difference Day, which has been expanded to a quarterly community clean up event. Neighborhood Kokua Day, Adopt a Bus Stop and Adopt a Wall are additional examples of Weed and Seed at work in Ewa Beach.

These are just a sampling of ways that Weed & Seed has made our communities a better, safer place in which to live. It has been a great partnership with all involved and we desire to see a continuation of the collaborative effort to weed out crime in our communities and to seed positive programs.

Attached are copies of petitions signed by over 1,700 people who agree that W&S has been a successful strategy and that it should be continued. Although the petitions mention support for a Grant-in-Aid request for continuation of the Weed and Seed strategy (we also applied for grant-in-aid funds), it can be assumed that the signers are supportive of any means of funding to continue the W&S strategy. As further stated in the petition, "We have found that Weed & Seed's collaborative strategy between residents, law enforcement, social agencies,

## private businesses, and nonprofit organizations has been effective in reclaiming, restoring, and rebuilding our neighborhoods."

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in favor of this measure and to submit the petitions signed by the many supporters of the Weed and Seed strategy.

My name is Maile Kanemaru, Director of Honolulu Weed and Seed, and now retired from the YMCA of Honolulu. I have been the Director of Weed and Seed for the past 12 years.

I am testifying in strong support of HB 1513HD1SD1 to sustain the Weed and Seed Strategy in Kalihi/Palama/Chinatown/Ala Moana, Waipahu and Ewa/Ewa Beach.

We are acutely aware of the financial challenges facing this committee as it searches for funding resources. However, we believe that this request for funding will not only be a good return on investment of public funds, but will attract and leverage additional funding from other resources.

The four fundamental principles that underlie the Weed and Seed Strategy are:

1) Collaboration – Weed and Seed requires communities to establish a collaborative process to capitalize on the full potential that the systemic interaction can provide. Government, (Federal, State and Local), social service agencies, community organizations and residents play important roles in community safety.

- 2) Coordination Weed and Seed helps bring together, the many agencies in the community and assists in the coordination of their activities. This eliminates overlap and duplication to get the maximum benefit from existing services and programs.
- 3) Community Participation Communities that are empowered to solve their own problems function more effectively than communities that depend on services provided by outsiders. Weed and Seed has motivated residents to get involved.

- 4) Leveraging resources Weed and Seed sites are expected to leverage all available resources to fully fund their strategies for law enforcement, crime prevention, and neighborhood revitalization.
  - Last year, 2010, a total of \$52,577 was leveraged from many organizations for all three sites.
  - A total of 1,517 volunteers participated in clean up campaigns and graffiti paint outs for a total of 378 hours or a value \$1,278,599 in labor hours. This figure was calculated based on the information from the independent sector web site on the value of volunteer time. http://independentsector.org/volunteer time
  - Through a relationship with the TARGET store, Weed and Seed was able to leverage surveillance cameras valued at \$100,000. These cameras are mobile and can be removed to use in other non Weed and Seed communities
  - The Festival Market Place/Business Incubator Project in Waipahu has provided 18 tenant stalls, created over 200 jobs and is envisioned to be a model that can be "transplanted" to other rural areas in Hawaii.
  - New businesses have established in the Waipahu Shopping Plaza including Jolibees Restaurant, Max's of Manila and Pacific Supermarket. This would not have been possible if crime was rampant in the community.
  - The Ewa site has partnered with Empower Oahu to offer Microenterprise training classes for low-moderate income households who desire to learn how to establish and run their own businesses.
  - Home ownership and foreclosure prevention counseling for Ewa Beach residents are also on the horizon. The Hawaii Home Ownership Center will be conducting workshops in the summer of 2011 on these topics.

Weed and Seed requires communities to establish a collaborative process to capitalize on the full potential that the interaction of stakeholders can provide. Such efforts encourage and bring about significant pressure that has led to the acquisition of additional resources.

Weed and Seed is an important organizational tool and community resource whose strategy needs to be continued.
