Chair Keith-Agaran and members of the House Committee on Judiciary, thank you for the opportunity to testify on House Bill No. 1613. The purpose of this bill is to provide for the application to register to vote to include a request for permanent absentee ballot. Additionally, the bill provides that a voter may request an absentee or permanent absentee ballot at any time but not later than 4:30 p.m. on the seventh day prior to an election.

Given that the bill would require the creation of a new form, the Office of Elections requests that it include appropriation language in the amount of \$57,000. This amount would cover the design, minority language translations required by federal law, and printing costs associated with the new form.
