Chair Oshiro, Vice Chair Lee, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Public Safety (PSD) supports the intent of House Bill 491. This bill requires PSD to pursue and obtain accreditation for the Sheriff Division from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA). We agree that the goal of obtaining accreditation will, as the State Auditor recommended, help ensure that proper law enforcement standards are met.

PSD would like to propose an amendment to House Bill 491, on page 3, line 7 "the department shall pursue [and obtain] accreditation for the Sheriff."

PSD feels that the use of the phrase "shall pursue and obtain accreditation" may

cause PSD to be in violation of this statue if the Sheriff Division does not obtain accreditation by December 1, 2014.

PSD has researched the cost of the 32-month accreditation process from the CALEA as being \$15,075.00, plus a \$4,850.00 annual continuation fee (or \$14,550.00 for three years). This is the cost if the Sheriff Division is successful in completing the accreditation process in 32 months, if not there is a 35% annual extension charge till accreditation is reached. Both the Honolulu Police Department and the Maui Police Department has informed PSD that it took their departments 2-3 years of preparation time to just prepare for the accreditation process. It took the Maui Police Department six years to obtain accreditation once they started the process. The Honolulu Police Department obtained accreditation in three years; however, they detached 6 officers to only work on the accreditation process during this time. PSD supports the accreditation of our Sheriff Division and asks that the Legislature consider the amendments proposed by PSD.

Representative Oshiro and Members of the Committee:

I support the intent of HB 491. This bill requires the Department to pursue and obtain accreditation for the sheriff division from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA), Inc. Obtaining accreditation will, as the State Auditor recommended, help ensure that proper law enforcement standards are met.

Meeting CALEA accreditation involves not only the Sheriff Division, but also many other functions within the Department. Fiscal, Personnel Recruitment, and Training that must also meet CALEA standards to obtain accreditation. Under the current organizational structure of the Department of Public Safety, I do not believe that accreditation can be obtained for just the Sheriff Division. It would also include the Department of Public Safety's Administrative divisions.

I recommend that this measure be deferred and the goal of CALEA accreditation be pursued as part of SB 11, which would separate the Sheriff Division from the Department of Public Safety and create a new Department of the Sheriff.
